president of this wonderful organization. Happy, but at the same time humbled, as I see the immense amount of work the other board members put in to make the Pacific Grove High School Alumni Association work. Put simply, that work is to serve others, and in doing so the PGHSAA is an influential, important part of the larger Pacific Grove community.

That community has gained a certain notoriety in the recent past for its

politics, and media attention often focuses on people who move to Pacific Grove because it is so perfect, and then immediately propose to make changes. Many of these recent arrivals are also active in local organizations, city commissions, and fund-raising efforts, and they donate their time and money to the schools, the library, the museum, and other worthy Pacific Grove causes. But in the back of my mind, whether these newcomers turn out to be a help or a hindrance, I am always reminding myself that there is one organization they can never join, no matter how much they might want to, and that's the Pacific Grove High School Alumni Association. There are few organizations that restrict their membership these days, but this one does! And, this select group has been investing its efforts in the high school, and by extension the town of Pacific Grove, for 50 years. The Pacific Grove High School Alumni Association's members include and have included mayors, city council members, fire chiefs, police chiefs, recreation directors, school board members, city employees, and others. These people are the ones who, in my mind, know Pacific Grove from the ground up. For that reason, they probably know what's best for it.

Here's an example. One of these city employees, Betty *Phipps* Voeykoff, a 1935 graduate, was the secretary to three city managers, starting at City Hall in 1946 and retiring in 1982. An active member of the PGHSAA for 33 years, Betty died on July 6 of last year at the age of 92. In her will, she left the Association \$52,500. This wise and generous contribution will continue to benefit the high school, and through it, the community, for many years. Betty, whose family built and owned Phipps Coffee Shop on Forest Ave. (later Tom's Café and now Max's Grill), contributed to what was important to her: the special community of Pacific Grove and its hard-working high school alumni association.

As I take over the reins of this association, I am especially grateful for people like Betty, whose foresight and big heart make the continuation of the Association's work possible. I am also thankful to outgoing president Terry Fink '69 for his guidance and input during the transition, and for the help of Treasurer Joanie *Hyler* '68, Recording Secretary Ruth *Grooms* Matthews '64, and Website Coordinator Wynette *Walker* Cowen '41. As Association members, you are in good hands with them and with the other board members who give of their time and energy to make the Association's gifts to the high school a reality. Please respond to the calls within this issue of the newsletter to join, give gift memberships, donate, volunteer, and participate.

Ruth Ann Paredes Carlson, born Nov. 22,







He wrote: "the president's message in the March 2006 "Knockout II" caused me to reminisce about my two and a half years at PGHS. I didn't realize it then, but now that I am in my 82nd orbit around the sun I know now that it was a super learning, maturing, fun time. Halfway thorough my sophomore year (Jan '39) my family moved to Pacific Grove. Before classes began at PGHS I spent several hours at Lovers' Point marveling at the waves crashing against the rocks - the fog - no sun - rain, but enjoying every moment. I cherish my learning, social and extracurricular activities at PGHS as an honor roll student, manager (water boy) for the '40 champion football team, less than remarkable third baseman for the '40-'41 and '42-'43 baseballs team, center for the '41 basketball team, part in the senior play and hi-jinx, and the picnics and weiner roasts and the dances and senior prom. I worked in the grocery department of Holman's and at the Le Mar Market on Lighthouse Avenue (one block west of Holmans). I logged several hours at the Grove Theater and the soda fountain next door with my high school friend Maxine (Wilson) Hoag. PGHS – its administrators, teachers, coaches and my classmates prepared me well for my entry into military service in October '42 and my future life. THANKS TO ALL OF THEM! Yours truly, George E. Toole, Class of '42." George was a member of PGHSAA for 47 years!

PG was lucky to have Don Gasperson By Phil Bowhay '47

Flashing back, when I write about Don Gasperson I also write about Pacific Grove. I suppose there are a few old timers around who have lived in P.G. more than 80 years, but not many gave any more to our hometown than Don.

He was a living piece of history, climbing on the rocks at the beach in the '30s, high school in the '40s, married to Jayne and raising kids in the '50s, fireman in the '50s and '60s, city council in the '70s and beyond.

Whenever my memory stuttered and stammered, I called Don for reference, and he always knew. How many church bells on Sunday? Name of the fountain next to the candy store next to the theater? Was it Ruby's or Johansen's where Peppers is now? When did the Woman's Club burn? Who bummed rides on the train from Asilomar? And lots more. And remember the Rat's Nest in the sand dunes? Oh boy!

Best I can remember, Don and I played

together before we were 5 at the playground down at Caledonia, and then on up through the years, grammar school, high school and beyond. We were on the same track team, in the same senior play, and held the same memories. We talked about Pacific Grove as it was then, and now, some changes huge, and some not at all.

He was the leader of our Pacific Grove High School Class of 1947, making sure we all stayed in touch. Couldn't make the last lunch he planned for us, but we felt like he was with us. Just two weeks ago.

We remembered the Del Monte Express train whistle, the cannery whistles calling the crews to work, and he was one of them, early. We really did like the smell of cooking sardines, and looked in awe at the Navy planes over the bay.

It was only natural for Don, growing up here, to develop a sincere responsibility for the community. Over the years, he knew almost everybody, and those he didn't know, Jayne did.

Once upon a time, when he was running for council, my mother sent him 10 bucks for his campaign. By return mail she got a handwritten thank you note. She never forgot

By coincidence, he was on duty and answered the call when my dad died. This almost poetic, since dad, a retired fire chief, would show up at fires and shout out advice, very unnecessary, and Don, always polite, would shout back, "Thanks, chief. We'll take care of it!"

I know a little about firemen, and it was just natural for Don to wind up as chief. He told about jerking sodas at Johansen's, and when the horn blew, halfway through constructing a banana split or not, he was out the door and up the hill, the station then part of the old city hall.

He said on those nights, on duty alone at the station, with a call coming in at 3 a.m., he seriously considered another line of work. Not possible. He felt responsible for every structure in Pacific Grove and he was quietly proud of his record. He knew every street and alley, and almost every tree, from Lovers Point to the top of the hill, from the Butterfly Grove to Eardley. Said his most painful loss was the Woman's Club, but he and his "laddies" saved so much more.

During his time on the council, his only agenda was what was right for the town. For the councils that followed him, he had mostly praise. Mostly!

So, end of another era. Don was lucky to have Pacific Grove, and boy, was Pacific Grove lucky to have Don Gasperson. Well done, chief!

a pastime born from a suggestion his mother once made during a coast-to-coast holiday trip.

"We were driving from New York to California, just enjoying the holidays, when she gave me the idea to make cardboard boxes look like bricks, then make them into fireplaces," says the 67-year-old Bennett, now retired after working the past 19 years in the local hotel industry.

"I started collecting little plastic creamer cups, cleaning them up, removing all the paper, and mounting them onto cardboard in the shape of a Christmas tree."

He does the same thing with ordinary plastic baskets used for packaging strawberries and cherry tomatoes, assembling them into pyramids to resemble festive evergreens.

His methods have evolved over the years. He now covers the cardboard base with cloth to eliminate glare in photographs. He affixes tiny Christmas lights — some that blink, others that don't — and hangs ornaments and pine cones from fishing line.

"The biggest challenge is getting the materials together," says Bennett, who cautions that it isn't easy to find a few zillion empty creamer cups. "But after you start making them, it's like eating M&M'S. You can't stop."

He also has made what he calls "a military rainbow" out of popcorn, and once built a lamb out of beer cans.

Christmas trees could be his calling, though.

"One of my trees won first prize at the Monterey County Fair," Bennett says. "I got a blue ribbon and five bucks."

RUBY's STORY

Ruby Johnson was born in Wichita Falls, Texas in 1920 and moved

with her family to Pacific Grove when she was in the second grade. She attended Pacific Grove Elementary School (now Robert Down) where she played the viola and "talked baseball" with her instrumental music teacher, J. F. O'Hanlon (who taught grades K thru 12 for decades). Her baseball/softball playing days actually started when she was 12 years old. By the time she was in high school, she was playing somewhere every weekend.

Ruby graduated from Pacific Grove High School in 1938. She sincerely cared for all she met there and in the city she served and loved for so long. Quote from PGHS 1938 yearbook "Sea Urchin": "Her love of sports is exceeded only by her friendliness". In her

Senior year her peers voted her the "Best Girl Athlete" and a member of the Hockey, Soccer, Volleyball, Baseball, Basketball, Speedball, Badminton and Ping Pong All Star Teams. She was a school Yell Leader and served as Treasurer for the Girls' Block PG among her many activities.

Her love for softball topped all sports and continued after her graduation. Her favorite position was catcher. She played on the Peninsula Women's Softball and the Alameda Women's Softball Teams. When a National Women's Softball League (ala the movie "A League of Their Own") was formed in 1938-1939, she played as a member of the World Champion Women's Softball Team sponsored by Bay Meadows Racetrack. That same year she was honored as the All American Catcher.

She loved our city of Pacific Grove and served as Recreation

Supervisor from 1952 until her retirement in 1980. During those years, she was the Pacific Grove "Rec" Club (Youth Center) Director. Any and all PGHS students who went there during those years won't ever forget Ruby as she loved and cared for each and every one of them, always being there for them in good or bad, happiness or sorrow. Martin Nodilo, the Pacific Grove Police Juvenile Affairs Officer, and Ruby were a great team. (They were married in 1956 until his untimely death in 1972.) There wasn't a kid in Pacific Grove who didn't know Martin and Ruby would both make every possible effort to always be there for them. They really, really cared!


At the time of her retirement, a Monterey Herald newspaper article, dated April 22, 1980, quoted Ruby as saying "If Martin had a youngster with a problem, or if I did, we'd talk about it and come up with a solution".

After her retirement, she moved to Bend, Oregon to be near her son, Bob Roberts (PGHS 1964), and his family. However, she managed to find time to drive down to PG in her trusty camper to visit often.

One of those visits was in August 1996, when the newly built "Youth

Center" on 17th Street was officially opened and appropriately named "The Nodilo Building" honoring both Martin and Ruby. Recreation Director John Miller (PGHS 1971) introduced Ruby with these words; "She ran the "Rec Club" for three decades and was mother, disciplinarian. and friend to hundreds of teenagers. She saw "good" or sought "good" in every kid who passed through those doors. She had only one son, but was blessed with many children who I see here today. The youth center had a special place in her heart, just as she has a special place in the hearts of those who are privileged to know her."

A story titled "Pet Parade Founder, Ruby Nodilo" written by Dixie Layne (PGHS 1966) in 2005 for the Pacific Grove "Beacon" noted: "In 1952, as activities director at Caledonia Park, she came up with the idea of a Pet parade to "keep the children off the streets". This proved to be so successful that the City asked Ruby to plan all activities for the Recreation Department and manage the "Rec" club, the gathering place for Pacific Grove teenagers. In 1958, Ruby's close friend, Elmarie Hurlbert Dyke (PGHS 1913), who with her husband, Clyde, was instrumental in reviving the "Feast of Lanterns" asked her if the Pet Parade could become a permanent part of that event. Today this seemingly small part of this annual July



event draws some 2000 participants and spectators. Until her retirement, Ruby continued as the Grand Marshall."

A few of the many awards to honor her were from: PTA; California Parks and Recreation; Pacific Grove Peace Officers; and Pacific Grove-New Monterey Lions Club.

She was interested in ALL things having anything to do with PGHS.

She helped with the year long preparations for the reorganizational PGHSAA meeting, April 1, 1962, at Asilomar where with a group of past PGHS Yell Leaders, she led the guests in familiar school yells. She has been a continuing member ever since. She also was an ex-officio member of "The PGHS Stadium Fund Committee" (that raised money and provided labor for the Lights and Bleachers at the Sunset Drive Campus Stadium) from 1962-1967. She was largely responsible for the idea of the money raising project of selling "Stadium Lots".




